UCLA Distinguished **Professor Glen MacDonald** has travelled the globe uncovering evidence of climate change and its impacts on the environment and on human societies. His northern research has been recognized internationally through honors such as the University of Helsinki Medal and election as a Fellow of the Royal Society of Canada. Glen is an award-winning teacher and author, with academic experience in Canada, the United Kingdom and the United States. Amongst his many honors is election to the National Academy of Sciences. Glen will share insights into Arctic ecology and how geography and climate have shaped the landscapes and ecosystems of the Arctic and Iceland, and influenced human history. He will also consider how current climatic changes are impacting the Arctic. Along the way Glen will share some of the adventures he has experienced during his many scientific expeditions in the far North.

GUEST SPEAKER

Felicity Aston MBE

There is an anecdote on Felicity Aston MBE's website that talks about her first "expedition" at the age of 9, which involved "being bribed" up a modest peak in England by her parents. Aston, now one of the most accomplished polar explorers and climate scientists of modern times, says this childhood milestone changed her life. Today, she is both the only woman in the world to have skied across Antarctica alone and the first person in the world to have traversed the continent purely by muscle power, which gave her a place in the Guinness World Records. Her polar career began two decades ago when she traveled to Antarctica as a meteorologist with the British Antarctic Survey. By age 23, she was monitoring climate change at the Rothera Research Station on the Antarctic Peninsula. Her Kaspersky Lab Commonwealth Antarctic Expedition was the first to "Tweet to the Pole" and material from her Pole of Cold expedition has been developed into a traveling art exhibition. Aston has since written five books and produces articles for publications in the U.K. and abroad. She is also owner of Iceland's beautiful Vigur Island, where she lives with her family.



Land of Fire and Ice

A land of unparalleled geological riches, Iceland is home to 4,500 square miles of glaciers, 30 active volcanic systems, 800 hot springs and more than 10,000 waterfalls. Born of the monumental forces unleashed during the movement of the North American and Eurasian tectonic plates and carved out by formidable glaciers and incredible waterfalls, the land is a combination of intense natural energy and veritable calm. The topography of Iceland continues to evolve, yet many of its landscapes remain nearly unchanged since the first Viking settlers laid eyes on them more than 1,100 years ago. During your cruise you will see volcanic craters and fissures, watch as bubbling hot springs erupt steam into the air against a backdrop of Mars-like terrain, encounter pristine waterfalls and black lava deserts, and witness the stoic majesty of mountains capped with snow and volcanoes slumbering beneath sheets of ice. Along the coast, Iceland's characteristic fjords chronicle the powerful path of the glaciers. Enjoy these natural wonders, in constant flux as glaciers calve and shift and new mountains emerge from volcanic lava flow. A startlingly beautiful portrait of Earth's history and progress, Iceland is a primordial landscape hewn by the forces of fire and ice.

Depart Home City

Day 1 | June 25

Depart home city for an overnight flight to Iceland.

Reykjavik, Iceland/ Embark World Traveller

Day 2 | June 26

Arrive in Reykjavik, Iceland's vibrant Nordic capital. Following lunch on your own, join your group for a panoramic tour of Laugardalur Park, home to colorful botanical gardens, recreational facilities and Iceland's only zoo.

Continue to the National Museum, where more than 2,000 artifacts provide a window to Iceland's rich history, culture and heritage. Step into the impressive Hallgrímskirkja Church and visit the Perlan to take in panoramic city views. Cap off your tour in Reykjavik's old town center before embarking the deluxe **World Traveller**. (B,D)

Vigur Island/Ísafjörður/ Bolungarvík

Day 3 | June 27

Uncover fascinating Icelandic heritage on Vigur Island, a private wildlife sanctuary owned by Guest Speaker Felicity Aston MBE and her husband Gísli. Embrace the opportunity to get close to arctic terns, eider ducks, puffins and black guillemots. See Iceland's only windmill and a vintage working boat used for ferrying goods and sheep. Relax over coffee and traditional cake with the Aston family and mail a postcard from Europe's smallest post office.

Return to the ship for a cruise to Ísafjörður; then set off to explore the astonishing Westfjords. Witness Ósvör, a replica of a 19th-century fishing station. From there, drive to Tungudalur Valley, home to a spectacular waterfall. On your drive back to Ísafjörður, savor views of the colorful architecture

and 18th-century, timber-framed houses. This evening, attend the Captain's Welcome Reception. (B,L,R,D)

Siglufjörður/ Grimsey Island/ Arctic Circle

Day 4 | June 28

Welcome to Siglufjörður, one of Iceland's most dramatically sited towns. Visit the award-winning Herring Era Museum, Iceland's largest maritime museum. This museum recreates the history of fish salting and oil processing during the early 20th century and offers visitors insight into the lives of fishermen who lived and work there during that time.

Return to the ship for lunch and cruise to Grimsey Island, which straddles the top of the world at 66 degrees north. Enjoy a view of the Arctic Circle during a short walk. (B,L,D)

Day 5 | June 29

Explore northern Iceland's extraordinary natural landscapes, driving to Goðafoss, or the "Waterfall of the Gods," to marvel at its scenic wonder. The tour continues to the pseudocraters at Skútustaðir, formed when hot lava flowed across the wetlands more than 2,000 years ago. From there you will walk among the surreal "dark castle" lava formations of Dimmuborgir and then drive along the shores of Lake Mývatn to Námaskarð — a geothermal wonder with hot springs, fumaroles and boiling mud pools. (B,L,D)

Seyðisfjörður

Day 6 | June 30

Visit the picturesque Blue Church on the 11-mile-long fjords of Seyðisfjörður and enjoy a specially arranged cultural and musical performance. You

will also have time at leisure to explore the town or hike the waterfall. (B,L,D)

Djúpivogur/Jökulsárlón

Day 7 | July 1

Depart on a scenic excursion along Iceland's eastern coast. During your drive, enjoy stunning mountain views and landscapes peppered with unique land formations and charming villages. Board a specially designed small boat for a private cruise amid the luminous icebergs of Jökulsárlón glacier lagoon in the UNESCO World Heritage-designated Vatnajökull National Park and touch the ice that has calved off the outlet tidewater glacier. (B,L,D)

Heimaey, Westman Islands/Cruise by Surtsey Island

Day 8 | July 2

Arrive at Heimaey Island, part of the Vestmannaeyjar

(Westman Islands) archipelago. Watch for the ruins of ancient Viking farmhouses dating from A.D. 650 in Herjólfssdalur Valley, observe Heimaey's largest puffin colony from the headland of Stórhöfði, and see a timbered stave church in scenic Skansinn. Behold the imposing Eldfell volcano and tour the Eldheimar Museum, which chronicles its fateful activity of 1973.

This evening, cruise along the coast of Surtsey Island, a UNESCO World Heritage site and one of the youngest and most fragile islands on Earth. Tonight, toast to your fellow travelers during the Captain's Farewell Reception. (B,L,R,D)
